

However, I have an idea that might help get that meet back here sooner.

Although I've never been in on the planning of this event, I can imagine that a major component is figuring out the routes for all the tours. Hmmmmm. What if you had access to the route and planning information about many tours in our area that another club has been running for over 50 years?

The Santa Clara Model T Ford Club hosts the Annual Endurance Run and Lowland Tour. 
